


The Question of a Lifetime



True holiness is the result of a supernatural change. It begins with a new heart, new desires, and a new power source found only in Christ.

God's Action, Our Response

INDICATIVE

You have been united with Christ in His death and resurrection.
You are reckoned to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.



IMPERATIVE

...do not let sin reign in your mortal body... but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead.



The Dual Nature of Holiness



Positional Holiness (Set Apart)

At conversion, God makes you holy. You are declared a "saint." Like special china set apart for a specific purpose, you have been been bought with a price and now belong to Him. This is a definitive act of God.



Practical Holiness (Set in Motion)


This definitive act begins a lifelong pursuit. It is a lifelong pursuit. It is a "conscious and continual labor," empowered by the Spirit, to become in practice what you already are in position.

The Work of a Lifetime

"Our chief aim must be conformity to the image of Christ... It is to separate ourselves from all that is opposed to Him. It is to mortify the flesh with its affections and lusts... It is a life task from which there is no diicharge while we remain in the body."

The work involves two simultaneous actions: putting to death everything that is not like Christ, and actively pursuing everything that is.

"It is not needful to be savage in order to be sanctified. A bitter spirit is a poor companion for a renewed heart... Follow peace but not at the expense of holiness. Follow holiness but not needlessly endanger peace."



The Difference Between a Struggle and a Surrender

The question is not "Do you sin?" but "Are you at peace with your sin?"

Remaining Sin

The normal struggle of a believer. You are in the fight, confessing sin and striving to forsake it. This conflict is evidence of new life.



Reigning Sin

A state of peace with sin. You excuse it, pursue it, and are not engaged in a struggle against it. This is a sign that should cause deep concern.

As believers, we are simultaneously just and sinners.

The struggle is expected.
